

Doing what Jesus did – a fresh look at the gifts of the Spirit

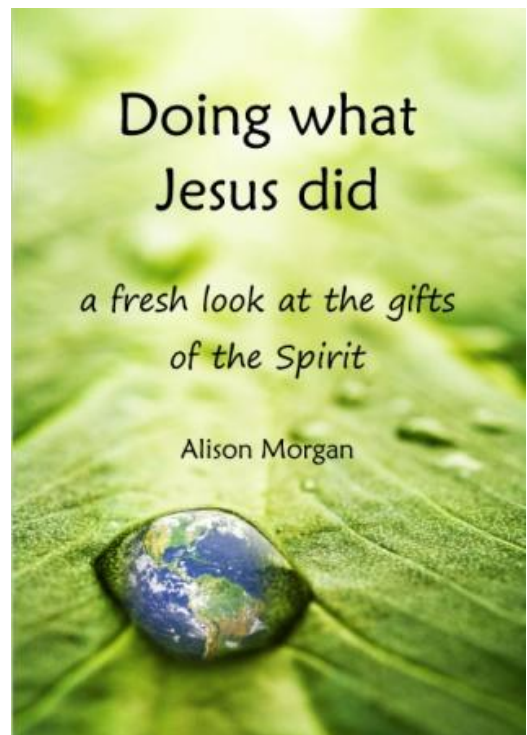

Doing what Jesus did takes a fresh look at the gifts of the Spirit, suggesting they are best regarded as a description of the ministry of Jesus, to be welcomed not as feathers in the caps of individuals but as shared resources made available to us as we set out together to help continue that ministry.

Alison writes with her usual clarity on a complex and contested subject, taking account both of the language and context of Paul's letter to the Corinthians and of the need for us to minister dynamically today into a world which is open to spiritual experience but often confused about where and how to find it. With lots of illustrations and plenty of real life stories and testimonies, this is a welcome and readable introduction to a topic about which little has been written in recent years. It includes a Bible study for use in small groups.
